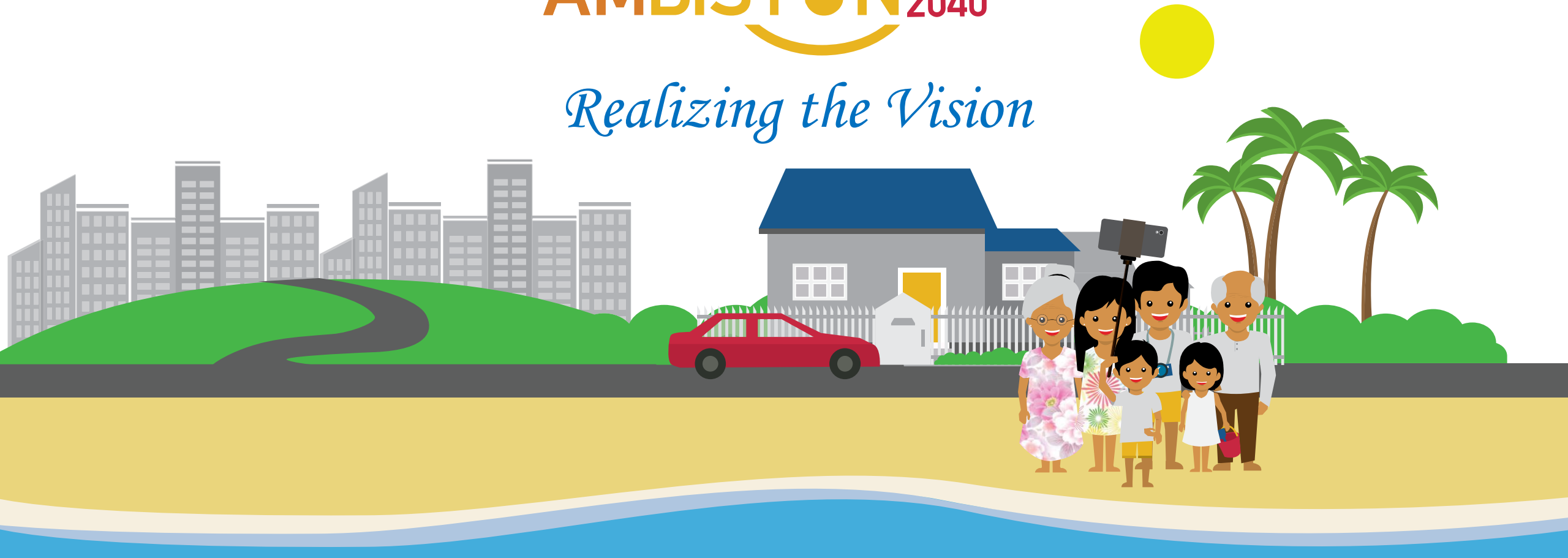

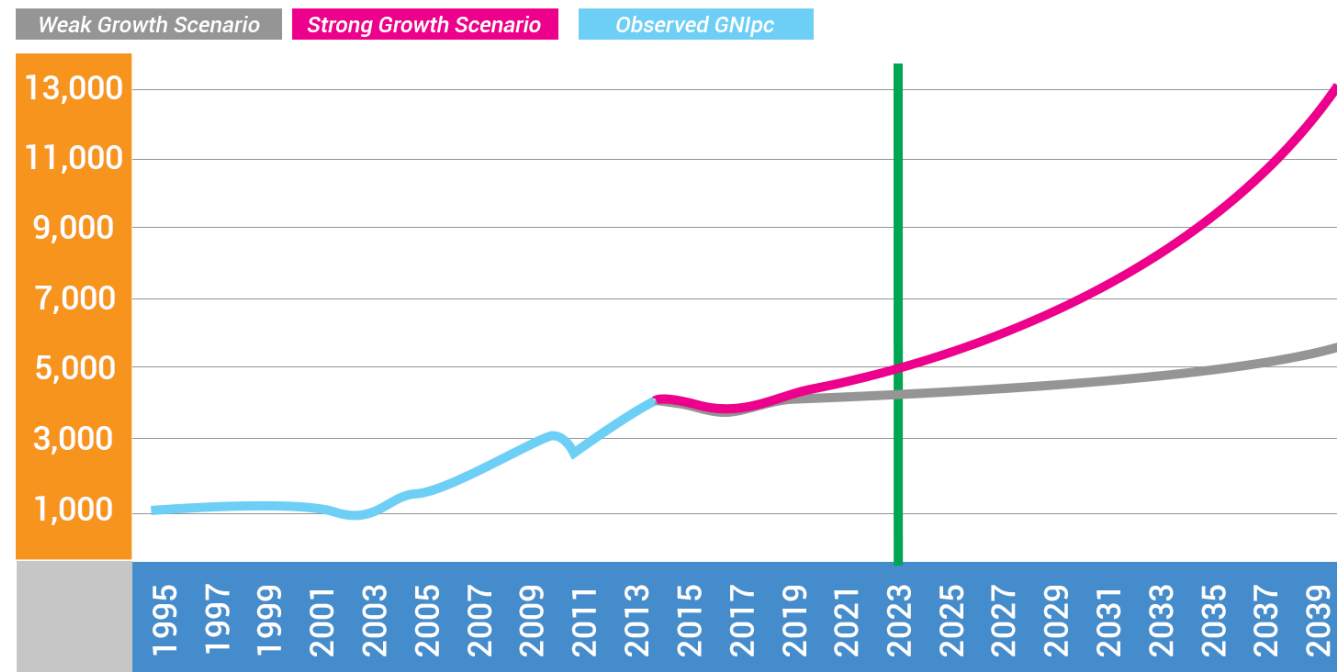

(in US\$ calculated using the World Bank Atlas Method)

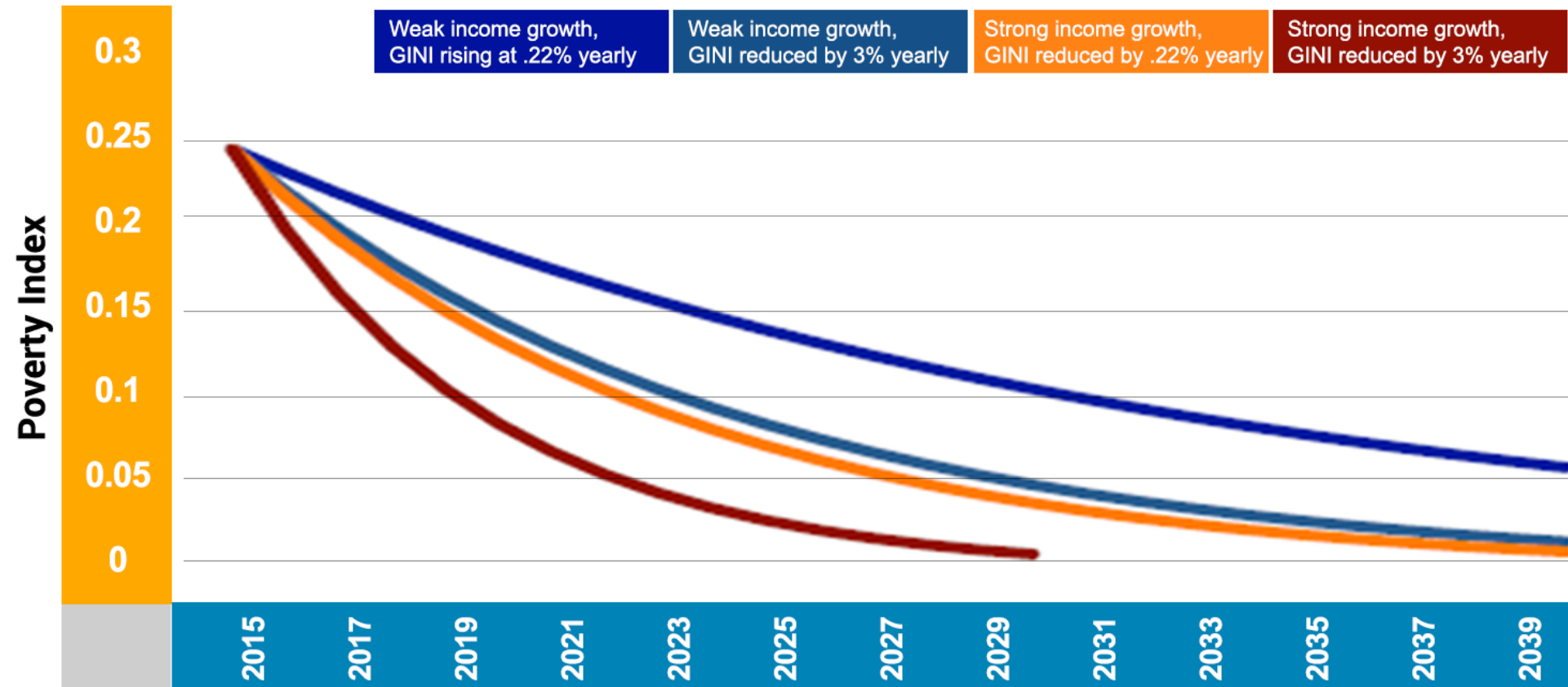
